AND WHEREAS the Province of Manitoba has prepared an expansion proposal outlining the terms and conditions of the Pembina Valley Watershed District to include additional municipal participation;

AND WHEREAS the council of the City of Morden has reviewed the proposal for the Pembina Valley Watershed District as prepared by the Province of Manitoba that supports a watershed-based approach to water management in Manitoba;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the council of the City of Morden approves the expansion proposal for the Pembina Valley Watershed District to include additional municipal participation and supports the continued membership of its existing municipal members in this program under the authority of The Watershed Districts Act.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Council of the City of Morden award the tender for the Lake Minnewasta Campground office to Scott Howard Contracting in the amount of \$468,139.00, this being the lowest tender received;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the project be borne by Gas Tax Funds as follows:

- \$169,244.50 to be allocated from the remaining 2021 budget
- \$298,894.50 + 10% contingency, for a total of \$328,783.95, to be allocated in the 2022 budget
