- RS-S & RS-L: Residential Single Family
- RT: Residential Two-Family
- RM-S, RM-M & RM-L : Residential Multiple Family
- RMH: Residential Mobile Home

Permits Not (Usually) Required

A development permit and a building permit are not required for a fence that complies with City of Morden By-Law 08-2017.


Construction Materials

Fences may be constructed of wood, vinyl, stone, brick, metal, or a combination of these materials. Electric, barbed-wire, and snow fences are not permitted in residential areas.

Maximum Fence Heights

As shown in Figure 1, the maximum height for fences (including walls, gates, and hedges) is:

• 4 ft (1.2) for a front yard




Figure 2. Diagram of typical yard definitions

• 6.5 ft (2 m) for rear and side yards To determine your front, side, and rear yards, use Figure 2.

Location of Fences

A fence may be constructed up to and along a property line but within property limits. If a fence is to be shared by an adjacent neighbour, it may be built on the property line.

Consider hiring a Land Surveyor to accurately locate property lines.


A Note About Hedges

Hedges, plantings, and structures that create a fence effect along property lines are subject to the same regulations as fences.

Fencing Around Pools

Residential properties with private pools are subject to additional regulations under the Manitoba Building Code.
